Programs

Adult Retreat – On September 25 and 26th we held a very successful Adult Retreat in Williamsburg, VA. The weekend focused on health and wellness. Highlights included tickets to Colonial Williamsburg, a presentation on healthy living through the lifespan, time for networking and support, dinner at a Historic Tavern, and an Inalex workshop on Managing Your Stress: Happy Times Ahead presented by Ken Glickman. Close to 30 attendees participated in this highly rated event. Thanks to Baxter for sponsoring this great event.

Advocacy – This year we continued our collaboration with HACA on the PACT grant. Our advocacy activities included:

- Another successful Richmond Days on January 16 and 17. Over 75 individuals attended and we made over 40 visits to different Virginia legislators. Through this annual activity, we are cementing relationships with our legislators who are increasingly aware of our policy concerns.
- Attended NHF's annual Washington Days (over 15 representatives from VHF and HACA) and met with 9 Senators/Congressmen's offices.
- Used VoterVoice, sent out 10 calls-to-action for state and federal issues.
- Submitted written comments twice and verbal comments once to the Virginia Health Reform Initiative on the subject of essential health benefits.
- Were successful in obtaining full funding for the FY 11-12 budget year for the Bleeding Disorders Program, which had been faced with a threatened 48% budget cut.
- Worked with three VHF members to serve as advocacy coaches.
- Monitored the actions of the Joint Commission on Health Care as it reviewed health care

- delivery options for uninsured individuals with chronic life-threatening conditions.
- Heard from Delegate Rosalyn Dance (63rd House District) at the VHF/HACA joint annual meeting, who encouraged members to become grass roots activists.

Annual Meeting – On June 18, 2011 over 100 folks joined us at the Second Baptist Church in Richmond, VA for the 1st VHF – HACA State Educational Meeting. The event started off on Friday night with the Diggity Dudes band. We have quite some dancers amongst us. On Saturday participants learned about Genotyping, Joint Health, and Advocacy. The kids had a great time with Gettin’ in the Game, Steve Kohrherr’s Drama Workshop, and Mad Science demonstration.
