President's Report

Dear VHF Friends and Families,

The Virginia Hemophilia Foundation (VHF) strives to 1) increase awareness and understanding about the causes of hemophilia and bleeding disorders, 2) empower those with bleeding disorders (and those around them) with a dedicated support network in our geographic area, 3) provide information and to serve as a central resource for all hemophilia and bleeding disorder issues, and 4) support research that may one day lead to a cure for hemophilia and other bleeding disorders.

VHF accomplishes these goals in many ways, such as providing financial support to the Hemophilia Treatment Centers (HTC's), donating to the World Federation of Hemophilia (WFH) and the Judith Graham Poole (JPG) Research Fellowship, as well as offering college and national meeting scholarships. The cornerstone of VHF continues to be the numerous events and educational programs where members of the community can come together to support each other and share their experiences and ideas on how they've handled the challenges of living with a bleeding disorder. Highlights of 2014-2015 include Camp Youngblood at CHT, where we had our largest group of campers yet! Campers had such a great time they were lobbying for 2 weeks of camp! In the fall, VHF was busy with back-to-back successes in fundraising with the Amazing Raise, Bowl-a-thon, and 5K. In fact, we ran so fast at the Impossible 5k that we bent the laws of time and space to finish back in time! The year ended with our annual winter gatherings in Charlottesville, Richmond, and Norfolk. During the winter of 2015, VHF was active advocating during the annual Richmond Days and NHF's Washington Days. In March we celebrated Hemophilia Awareness month with another Bowl-a-thon and our first (of hopefully many) HFA Blood Brotherhood event where men from the bleeding disorder community came together and discussed how we could help make this organization better for the next generation. The fiscal year ended in Suffolk, VA at our ever popular Annual State Education Meeting. All in all we had 35 events! We are so grateful to our volunteers, members, sponsors, and medical providers who help VHF to meet the needs of the bleeding disorder community.
