While taking part in in-person events held or sponsored by VHF, consistent with <u>CDC</u> <u>guidance</u>, participants are encouraged to help to protect yourself and others and practice basic health and hygiene. When attending a VHF event, you agree to assume all risks, both known and unknown, and assume full responsibility for your participation.

Do not plan to attend a VHF in-person event if:

- You are sick or have any symptoms.
- You have been exposed to a respiratory virus within the past 5 days.

VHF Event Cancellation Policy

We have a no-questions-asked cancellation policy. Whether you experience a bleed right before traveling or have been exposed to COVID-19, we understand that emergency and illness are out of your control. We ask that you remember to cancel your registration ASAP so that VHF does not incur any extra costs in paying for no-shows or late cancellations.
